What's Your Heritage? Welsh in Wisconsin

Welsh immigrants, like the Irish, were the most easily identifiable British immigrant group in Wisconsin. The Welsh made a conscious effort to settle in rural enclaves apart from other English and American settlers. Welsh immigration occurred primarily between 1840 and 1890 with the peak years between 1850 and 1860. The earliest known Welsh settlers in Wisconsin arrived in Genesee in Waukesha county in 1840. Most Welsh became farmers and settled in the southeastern counties. The largest groupings were in southern Winnebago County, where five Welsh Churches were established; and in the eastern half of Columbia county, western Dodge county, and southern Green Lake and Marquette counties.

Cornish in Wisconsin

The Cornish were the first settlers from the British Isles to arrive in Wisconsin. Calling themselves Cornish rather than English, they came from Cornwall County in England where they worked in lead and tin mining. The opening of mines in Illinois and Wisconsin brought a stream of Cornish settlers between 1830 and 1850. In 1850, roughly 7,000 of the 28,000 English settlers in the lead region were Cornish. The lure of gold in the west and the decline of the lead industry in Wisconsin led many Cornish to leave Wisconsin in the mid-19th century. (This information was from the Wisconsin State Historical Association.)

Background and Rules for Eisteddfod Entries

To enhance and encourage an appreciation of Welsh culture and tradition, in 2009 an Eisteddfod competition and awarding of a chair was added to the activities of Trydedd Penwythnos Cymreig i Bawb (Third Welsh Weekend for Everyone) in Wisconsin. In 2009 and 2010 entries in the form of poetry were required. In 2011 the competition was broadened to include essays as well. Each year a theme is chosen. The basic rules for entries are these:

The call to bards for the Chair competition: Barddoniaeth neu Ysgrif/ Poetry or Essay;

Gwobr/Prize: Cadair yr Eisteddfod / Eisteddfod Chair
