WELSH TEACAKE RECIPE



This recipe was used for many years by club charter member Dilys Spransy, mother of board member Dot Spransy. Jan Batty remembers Dilys up to her elbows in dough when we made teacakes for the World's Greatest Cookie Sale.

Preheat griddle to 325 degrees. You might have to go to 360 degrees, depending on the griddle.

Mix together:

4 cups flour (1 lb)

1 cup sugar (1/2 lb)

1 tsp baking soda

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp salt

1 tsp nutmeg

Cut in (I use the dough hook on my KitchenAid):

1 cup butter (2 sticks – room temperature)

This takes a while – make sure the dough looks crumbly before you continue.

Mix in:

2 beaten eggs

1/2 cup milk



1 cup currants (per Jan Batty: do not substitute raisins or our Druid ancestors will seek you out)

Chill dough for a few hours or overnight.

Roll dough to 1/4 inch thick. You will need to sprinkle out a lot of flour so that the dough doesn't stick to the rolling surface. Cut with 2" round cutter.

Bake on dry griddle until bottom is browned and top becomes slightly dry. Flip and bake on other side.

As soon as you remove the cakes from the griddle to a cookie sheet or shallow pan, sprinkle with caster sugar (finely granulated) or regular granulated sugar on both sides.

Cool thoroughly on a rack before storing. Freezes well.

Recipe makes 88 (7 ¼ dozen) cakes.
